LOCATION AND PARKING

The Museum is located at <u>300 N Houston Street</u>, <u>Dallas 75202</u>, with a parking garage situated directly across Houston Street from the main entrance. Complimentary self-parking is available in the Museum's parking garage. Please show the attached parking pass to the Parking Ambassador to redeem.

SECURITY

Upon entry, all visitors to the Museum must pass through metal detectors and have their belongings scanned or searched. No weapons or hazardous materials will be allowed into the Museum. View Museum policy on prohibited items here.

MASK POLICY

Face masks for visitors, staff, and volunteers are optional as of March 1, 2022.

SANITARY AND CLEANING MEASURES

- There are numerous hand sanitizer stations throughout the Museum.
- We have increased cleaning of high-touch areas.
- We have modified Wings, Galleries, and Theaters to ensure that proper social distancing can be observed.
- We have implemented deep-cleanings after each film showing.
- We have placed directional signage throughout the Museum.

ACCESSIBILITY

The Museum is accessible to people with disabilities and complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Service animals, as defined by the ADA, are welcome.

Before coming to the Museum, individuals with sensory needs can download the free <u>KultureCity</u> app to read about sensory features that are available in the Museum and where to find them.

Video and interactive components in the permanent exhibition are captioned in Spanish and English. The Museum offers a free, downloadable phone-based app, **DHHRM Audio Tour**, with a 90-minute self-guided tour in Spanish or English.
